Road Work

- Other roads were chosen to help cut costs of \$177,000. Budgeted \$177,000 more than costs
- Capital works not received yet. Should we get approved, we can pick other roads to pave
- Total Request \$820,977.48. Our total would have been 328,436.44
- Grant value for spending
- Phase 2 done today. Phase 3 start tomorrow
- Meeting tomorrow with head of West Coast Excavating 2:00, meeting 12:00
- Finish outside Fire Hall
- Demolition of house and shed Second Avenue
- Building by marina needs walls replaced all pieces are built and ready to put together once moved to site (built in garage)
- Fire hall attic infested with ants, Dave and Herb put ant traps in place
- Basement Town Hall full of mold, Dave and Herb removed and replaced.

- Councillor works shift work and have jobs and other obligations
- Liaisons are not required to attend meetings forward email request when meetings are scheduled but that does not mean that liaison will be present in meeting.
